

ESG Study is well received

In response to external market and political pressures, BND was tasked by the 2023 Legislative Assembly with assessing complex trends and policies affecting the state's businesses and industries.

This effort culminated in the creation of STAND—Sustain, Transform, and Authenticate North Dakota—a cross-sector initiative developed in partnership with elected officials, private industry, and state agencies and associations. STAND serves as a platform for sharing authentic stories of sustainability, innovation, and transformation, with a focus on energy, agriculture, conservation and carbon management.

Since the STAND report was presented to the interim Energy Development and Transmission Committee in July, it has sparked meaningful discussions across various industries and government officials both within North Dakota and on the national level. The report has been widely praised for its scope and cross-functional approach, offering a comprehensive framework for realistic and impactful economic advancements. The feedback has highlighted the initiative's potential to drive meaningful progress in key sectors, positioning North Dakota as a forward-thinking leader in sustainability and economic transformation.
